ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH 989-673-8119

Provides services to ensure compliance with State and County environmental regulations. Protects and preserves water and land resources. Acts as a resource for various environmental programs including lead, radon, vermin, water quality, wastewater disposal, surface water, food service, etc. The Environmental Health Division receives applications and issues permits for sewage disposal systems and water wells; issues licenses for temporary and fixed food service establishments; inspects campgrounds, day care facilities, public swimming pools, body art facilities, and conducts complaint investigations.

EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS 989-673-1694

Ensures the preparedness of the Health Department, Local Agencies and the Public to respond to public health emergencies. Prepared for natural disasters, infectious disease outbreaks, chemical, biological, radiological, nuclear and explosive threats.

SERVICES OFFERED AT THE TUSCOLA COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT

MIBRIDGES NAVIGATION PARTNER 989-673-8114

Available to all residents of Tuscola County. MI Bridges Navigators provide assistance in helping you apply for healthcare coverage, food assistance, cash assistance, childcare or emergency assistance. Navigators can also assist with creating a MI Bridges account and information and referrals to Medicaid programs, providers, and resources.

MATERNAL INFANT HEALTH PROGRAM (MIHP) 989-673-1750

A free home visiting program for pregnant people, infants and families with Medicaid Insurance. A nurse and social worker will provide evidence based education, support and community referrals that promote having a healthy and safe pregnancy. We will then help with infant care, development information, resources and parenting

support during baby's first year.





CHILDREN'S SPECIAL HEALTH CARE SERVICES (CSHCS) 989-673-1856

CSHCS strives to enable individuals who have special healthcare needs with improved health outcomes and enhanced quality of life through access to resources, support for families, and case management. Children can be sent on a free diagnostic visit to a pediatric specialist to assist in establishing medical eligibility.

IMMUNIZATIONS/COMMUNICABLE DISEASE PUBLIC HEALTH 989-673-8116

We provide immunizations for all ages, host seasonal flu clinics, provide regular offsite clinics in Vassar and Cass City, and travel to other locations as needed. TB testing is done by appointment. Case investigations and follow-up is completed on communicable diseases such as TB, Hepatitis, and foodborne illness. Information and education provided to community members, healthcare facilities, and schools on prevention, exclusion, and protection from communicable disease.

FAMILY PLANNING 989-673-8118

Services for both men and women of childbearing age. Confidential counseling, birth control supplies, pregnancy testing and STI information. Fees are based on a sliding fee scale.

STI/HIV 989-673-8118

Sexually transmitted Infection testing, treatment, referrals and education. Confidential HIV testing with same day results, counseling and referrals.

HEARING & VISION 989-673-1717

School-based screenings are provided throughout the school year, including at Kindergarten Round-Up's and Head Starts. Screenings are also offered at the Health Department by appointment.





VETERANS AFFAIRS 989-673-8148

The County of Veteran Affairs is the first point of contact by Veterans and their families who seek assistance with Federal, State, and County Benefits including: home loans, education assistance, health care, vocational rehabilitation, burial benefits, and emergency relief assistance.



GERIATRIC PROGRAM 989-673-1753

A Geriatric Nurse accepts referrals from doctors, nurses, family members, neighbors and/or friends to assess and assist elderly people who have home management and/or health problems. We serve as a liaison to community resources for the elderly. Adult immunizations available for Flu, Pneumonia, and Shingles.

WOMEN, INFANT & CHILDREN/ BREASTFEEDING (WIC) 989-673-3199

Offers nutrition education and supplemental food benefits for children under the age of five and pregnant or nursing women.
Breastfeeding education and support is provided by a Peer Counselor. Families must meet income guidelines.
